#### General information

##### Inhalation

If symptoms develop, immediately move individual away from exposure and into fresh air. Seek immediate medical attention; keep person warm and calm. If person is not breathing, begin artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, administer oxygen.

##### Skin contact

Remove contaminated clothing. Wash exposed area with soap and water. If symptoms persist, seek medical attention. Launder clothing before re-use.

##### Eye contact

If symptoms develop, immediately move individual away from exposure and into fresh air. Flush eyes gently with water for at least 15 minutes while holding eyelids apart; seek immediate medical attention.

##### Ingestion

Seek medical attention. If individual is drowsy or unconscious, do not give anything by mouth; place individual on their left side with the head down. If individual is conscious and alert, induce vomiting by giving syrup of IPECA or by gently placing two fingers at the back of the throat. If possible, do not leave individual unattended.

### Suitable extinguishing media

Carbon dioxide, dry chemical, foam or water mist for small fires.

Use alcohol type or all purpose type foam by manufacturers recommended for large fires.
